HURRICANE HELENE STRIKES FLORIDA'S GULF COAST

THE AFTERMATH OF THIS 140 MPH STORM

Just last Thursday, disaster struck Florida's Gulf coast with hurricane Helene, with winds above 140 mph and a 15ft storm surge. Initiated estimates by insurance specialists put damages at as high as \$160 billion, and the devastation caused to towns left them permanently altered or destroyed.

Helene, the eighth named storm of the 2024 Atlantic hurricane season, spent several days strengthening over the warm waters of the Gulf of Mexico before dumping its full brunt on the mainland US. Currently, the death toll is at 215 souls. Of these, over half took place in North Carolina. A total of 300 persons were reported missing, but as of last Friday, the Asheville Police Department claimed that 270 of them had been located. The FBI and Department of Homeland Security are providing support to the police as they investigate 75 active cases of missing persons in the city.


The worst of it is unfortunately not over, with hundreds of communities still stranded, missing things like food, water, electricity, and their homes. Last Friday, over 700,000 residences and commercial buildings, primarily in Georgia and the Carolinas, were without electricity.

Chimney Rock is one example. Every house or structure in the village, which is located roughly 20 miles southeast of Asheville, was destroyed by the intense floodwaters. The formerly picturesque mountain community has completely collapsed, who had less than 200 people living formally there.

"Every single business, every single building has been destroyed or severely damaged," Mayor Peter O'Leary said.

"When you talk about the actual landscape of western North Carolina, there's like small towns, there's larger towns, but if you live on the side of a mountain you might like have one way in and one way out," Said 32-year-old

Jazmine Rodgers, a consultant for nonprofit groups, has been lending a hand to neighbors in the severely affected city of Asheville. "And if a bunch of large trees blow over on your main street, people are trapped... We're talking about entire mountainsides completely gone. We can't really account for how many people are missing because there's little hollers (or valleys) all over western North Carolina, little pockets of communities, little trailer parks. And if you don't have family in those areas, you probably never heard of them."



T-MOBILE DATA BREACH

...AND THE \$31.5 MILLION SETTLEMENT

The U.S. FCC has reached a \$31.5 million settlement with T-Mobile regarding major data breaches that impacted over 10 million U.S. customers over three years.

An investigation has found T-Mobile responsible for breaching security conditions by failing to secure data adequately and failing to report unauthorized access to consumer data. The compromised data includes consumers' names, phone numbers, account numbers, billing addresses, credit card balances, purchase history, credit card information, and device IDs.

T-Mobile was originally fined \$60 million by the Committee on Foreign Investment in the U.S. (CFIUS). The committee oversees foreign investments in the U.S. for national security reasons, with the authority to block and impose conditions and penalize violations.

T-Mobile has agreed to pay \$15.75 million in civil penalty and another \$15.75 million over the next 2 years to strengthen and secure its cybersecurity program. T-Mobile has made several statements on the matter

KRIS KRISTOFFERSON'S PASSING

BELOVED ACTOR AND COUNTRY MUSIC STAR DEAD AT 88

Kris Kristofferson, a country music star and widely recognized actor died on the 28 of September in his Maui home. He was 88 years old.

Born in the state of Texas in 1936, Kristofferson was the eldest of three children and a star student throughout his education. After high school, Kristofferson studied creative writing at Pomona College and graduated Phi Beta Kappa in 1958. He then went on to receive a Rhodes scholarship to Oxford University in England where he earned his master's degree in English.

Kristofferson later joined the U.S. Army and served as a helicopter pilot and eventually earned the rank of captain. During his time in the military, Kristofferson played in an army band where he would sharpen his skills in singing and songwriting.


Eventually, Kristofferson settled in

Nashville, Tennessee with his family and landed a job at Columbia Records as a janitor. He used this opportunity to network and familiarize himself with prominent and successful figures in the country music industry.

Kristofferson would eventually meet Johnny Cash who would help him launch his music career. "It was electric. He kind of took me under his wing before he cut any of my songs. He cut my first record that was record of the year. He put me on stage the first time," He told The Associated Press in a 2006 interview.

After this, his music career saw major success, winning 3 Grammy Awards and having his songs covered by artists such as Janis Joplin and Ray Price.

Kristofferson also ventured into acting, landing several major roles in his career. His first role was in Dennis Hopper's "The Last Movie," in 1971. He then went on to act in Sam Peckinpah's

1973 "Pat Garrett and Billy the Kid," John Sayles' 1996, "Lone Star," and starred alongside Barbara Streisand in the 1976 "A Star Is Born."

Kristofferson had many talents and passions that he was able to share with the world during his time and his contributions to all of his fields of interest will have a major impact for years to come.

"What a great loss, what a great writer, what a great actor, what a great friend," Dolly Parton said in a statement. "I will always love you."

FEMA BUDGET DEPLETED

DISCUSSING WHAT'S NEXT FOR HURRICANE HELENE VICTIMS

With the true aftermath of Hurricane Helene becoming clear, the plan for recovery and emergency assistance is in full swing. But throwing a wrench in these efforts is the fact that the Department of Homeland Security has claimed that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) does not have the funds to properly administer care to all affected areas. Seeing that natural disaster relief is one of the only reasons FEMA is deployed, the Agency is coming under heavy scrutiny for this. Not helping their case is the fact that Helene is the deadliest hurricane since Katrina, another disaster in which FEMAs response was heavily criticized. With there still being months left of hurricane season, where did this money go, and will they receive an emergency budget increase before the year is up?

While most of FEMAs spending for the year can be properly tracked to natural disaster relief, many are fixating on the fact that multiple sources claim that over \$600 million dollars of their budget for the year went towards areas dealing with an influx of migrants. While this number seems high, it is just a relatively small percentage of their total budget, which was requested to be over \$30 billion. But with an already unfavorable reputation, the fact that money designated for Americans in need is being spent on migrants does not bode well with many. Because of this, it might be difficult for the Agency to get allocated

more money through congress. This issue has already been brought to congress multiple times over the summer, but no true bill has been passed that would ensure FEMA has funding to properly respond to hurricane Helene.

Even with all of the assistance from private citizens and companies, the lack of FEMA response thus far is not what the residents of the affected areas need. Hopefully a solution is reached quickly, for the sake of everyone involved.

THE WALZ-VANCE DEBATE: A CONFOUNDING RETURN TO NORMALCY

"Remember when politics was boring?"

This sentiment has remained a common refrain since the 2016 election redefined politics both within America and worldwide. It's become a recurring catchphrase as Americans grow jaded from the world of global pandemics, attempted coups and pet-eating urban legends that they have had to accept as the "new normal". Under every social media headline, you can find dozens of posters waxing nostalgic for a time where the average citizen could comfortably tune out the constant hum of democracy. The "good old days".

And indeed, the 2024 election started off with an uninspiring continuation of incumbent President Biden's 2020 "return to normalcy" campaign. While the campaign worked for a new candidate in the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, when Americans could still believe Trump would be out of the news as soon as he left office, this idea fell flat before Biden even set foot in the White House. The Jan. 6 attack on the Capitol destroyed the notion that Trump would leave American politics so soon.

By 2024, a "return to normalcy" campaign did zero favors for Biden as an incumbent president. Americans understood that "normalcy" no longer meant a pre-Trump America-it meant a return to the status quo, four more years of the same. Clearly Americans are not satisfied with this, with Biden's approval rating hovering around 40% since September 2021.

The Trump campaign was able to capitalize on this low approval and point to high interest rates and a worsening housing crisis as proof that Biden's status quo wasn't working. As a former POTUS himself, however, Trump could not (and still cannot) take advantage of

undecided voters the way he could in

The race overall was stuffy, stagnant, and the failing physical and cognitive health of both candidates seemed to reflect that. Biden's embarrassing performance during the debate this past June marked the peak of despair for engaged Democrats.





So when Kamala Harris suddenly stepped up to replace Biden, the entire vibe shifted. It was a breath of fresh air for Democrats who had felt resigned to the lesser of two evils.

What was most interesting, though, was an apparent rejection of old Obama-era "When they go low, we go high" tactics. Democrats were able to take advantage of their new candidate-and the fact that the Trump campaign had no good attacks against her yet--and go on the offensive against Republicans who had long since taken advantage of aggressive us-vs.-them posturing.

"These are weird people on the other side," said Walz of MAGA Republicans in a July TV interview. Meanwhile, "We're not going back", the Harris' campaign's sleeper-hit slogan, only gained more good vibes when it came out that their campaign advisors had rejected the message for not being "positive" enough.

In the face of this race up until this point, which has been called "the clos-

being the wild card candidate to pull est race of a generation" by the New York Times, the VP debate was strikingly...boring. Far from the September debate, in which the Presidential candidates made jabs at each other, JD Vance and Tim Walz acted positively pre-Trump. Vance, after claiming "millions of illegal immigrants" were taking away housing and jobs from Springfield citizens in Ohio, quickly followed it up with, "I actually think I agree with you [Tim]...I think you want to solve this problem, but I don't think that Kamala Harris does." Walz acted similarly civil towards Vance, a far cry from the "weird"

claims motivating liberal voters the past 10 weeks. He went hardest on abortion, but the messaging was a carbon copy of Kamala's speech in her own debate. Vance was able to put his politician skills to good work and appear much more reasonable than Trump did in his debate, as Walz did not bring up any of the incriminating remarks Vance has made on wanting a national abortion ban or saying "childless cat ladies" should not be able to

This debate marked the end of the honeymoon period for the Harris and Walz campaign. The GOP has found its footing in attacking Harris by tying her to the stagnant Biden presidency, and the new campaign has settled down as it tries to appeal to centrist voters in the close swing state races. But while this may not move the needle on the election itself-the polls have been steady for the past few weeks-it is disheartening for young and progressive voters high on "good vibes" to see a return to normalcy after all.

WHAT MADE RFK JR. SWITCH?

AN ANALYSIS OF RFK JR'S ENDORSEMENT OF DONALD TRUMP

Robert F. Kennedy Jr. made history last month, going against countless generations of family political tradistions and endorsing Donald Trump for president. The Kennedy family is one of the most prominent families in the Democrat party, with members holding virtually all available positions in the US over nearly 150 years. This includes the highest elected office, as RFK's uncle was the 35th president of the United States, John F. Kennedy. So after all this, as well as running for the democratic nomination for president himself, what made RFK switch his al-

Despite a fairly recent entry into politics, RFK has always lived his life in support of his beliefs. His first career utilized his law degree from Harvard and the University of Virginia, as he became the chief attorney for Riverkeeper, a nonprofit committed to cleaning up and preserving waterways. He was with the organization for over 30 years, and during his tenure also involved himself in other preservation and cleanup efforts. While Trump does not hold the same passion in this area, RFK has stated that they share the same basic goal of environmental preservation.

Another one of RFKs primary issues is the health of Americans. Right after his endorsement of the Trump ticket, the phrase "Make America Healthy Again" was coined. Kennedy has a long past of casting doubt on "Big Pharma" and government agencies for the role he perceives they play in the rapid decline of American health. His thoughts on this range from criticizing the increase in consumption of processed foods, to a skepticism of vaccines. These views largely went against the grain of his former party, and align much better with what the republican ticket runs on. They align so well that, if elected, Donald Trump might appoint Kennedy to be his Health Secretary.

Focusing a bit more on the endorsed party, one of the largest issues of focus for Trump is immigration. Promising a complete revamp of the system, as well as the largest mass deportation in American history. While Kenne-

dy does not echo these beliefs entirely, his immigration stance is certainly further right than the vast majority of the democrat party, as he also pushes for reform and more border security. This aligns with his general belief that the United States should be more isolationist. Which is especially seen in his foreign relations policy where he and Trump believe that diplomacy should take preference over military involvement. He has been critical about funding given to Ukraine, another stance that separated him from the democrat

But despite the numerous policies that Kennedy and Trump agree on, perhaps their greatest likeness does not come from their policy stances at all. Both men represent an "outsider" approach, with a minimal background in politics, and a status quo that did not align with the traditional views of their party, which has given them both cult followings. With the election nearing, only time will tell how much RFK Jr's endorsement meant to the Trump campaign, and if this is the beginning of a historic Kennedy party switch, or just a one off instance.

ED GEIN: THE GRISLY REALITY BEHIND LEATHERFACE

A FURTHER INSIGHT INTO THE ORIGIN OF THIS ICONIC HORROR FILM

This week, on the 11 of October, the infamous horror film "The Texas Chainsaw Massacre" celebrates its 50th anniversary. Despite the campy title, the film is a mostly bloodless, psychological horror as well as slasher. The film tells the story of Sally Hardesty and her friends as they get lost in the Texas wilderness and stumble across the Sawyers, a family of cannibals. However, today we are not discussing the Sawyer family. Instead we will be discussing the infamous villain of the Texas Chainsaw Massacre franchise, Leatherface. Did vou know that Leatherface and his hobbies as a slasher were inspired by the brutal events surrounding a real serial killer? Leatherface's inspiration comes from the criminal Ed Gein, also known

as the Butcher of Plainfield. But who was Ed Gein?

Ed Gein was born on the 27 of August, 1906, and didn't have an easy going childhood. His father was an alcoholic and his mother was verbally abusive. Nevertheless, he had a great love for his mother, which would later inspire his dark acts. This difficult childhood inspired an adulthood that would go on to inspire horror films and disgust within the hearts of many looking back on his career. Ed Gein first was noticed by police in 1957 when a hardware store owner disappeared. The police went onto Gein's farm after he was spotted with her shortly before the disappearance. What they had found was enough to solidify Gein as a horrific true crime figure. Along with the decapitated body of Bernice Worden, the hardware store owner,

they found body parts from robbed graves that Gein used to make masks, clothing, and other household items. Gein was later arrested and explained to authorities that he killed two women because they looked like his mother. He eventually died in a mental hospital in 1984 after being charged with only one of the murders.

Despite not taking as many innocent lives as Ted Bundy or Jeffrey Dahmer, the impact Ed Gein left on the true crime world was unforgettable. Ed Gein's crimes would go on to inspire Norman Bates in "Psycho," Buffalo Bill in "Silence of the Lambs," and most importantly Leatherface from The Texas Chainsaw Massacre franchise. He even will be receiving more modern notoriety appearing on season three of Netflix's "Monsters." From the masks made from deceased faces to his unsta-

Minecraft, a game that has captured the hearts of millions, is set to release its anticipated movie on April 4, 2025. Initially, the announcement thrilled fans who hoped for an official adaptation that could mirror the charm of the game. With engaging storytelling and memorable characters seen in Minecraft: Story mode, many fans were eager to see what the studios could do with Minecraft. The blueprint for a beautifully made movie had al-

through countless inspired fan animations that demonstrated the game's rich narrative potential and creativity. The whole concept behind Minecraft is a place where freedom of expression and creativity is endless.

However, the release of the two Minecraft trailers has left fans mortified, primarily due to the decision to make it live-action. The visuals due to the realistic live-action format altered the iconic looks of the monsters, animals, and even characters from the beloved "blocky" appearance to horrifying realistic/fantasy creatures. The film follows four misfits who find them-

selves transported into the Minecraft universe, where they confront the uncomfortable-looking mobs and the legendary Steve. The visual style has been the subject of heavy criticism, similar to the Sonic movie, due to its unappealing style. All the mobs appear strangely realistic in contrast to the game's pixel aesthetic, creating an unsettling and noticeable contrast. The image of the mobs the viewers have is vastly different from the ones the studio has given, creating a disconnect between the movie and its viewers. Moreover, the choice to have the four human characters keep their 3D form does not pair well with the coherence within the Minecraft world the movie created. They look very out of place. It is also strange that a pre-existing character in the Minecraft world, such as Steve, would be a 3D character and not also a combination of realistic/fantasy that the animals have. The consistency in the movie seems strange and would have been better if it stuck to making Steve an animated "blocky" character. Overall, the movie lacks many characteristics that a normal Minecraft game would have, making the movie feel like a Minecraft-inspired movie and not THE Minecraft movie. This movie does not embrace the blocky, pixelated design of Minecraft and reflects a missed opportunity to honor the game's original aesthetics. "Your Clean. Jason Vendetta I presume?" I nodded.


"Right this way sir."


10.08.24 Almost the entire wall was a one way mirror, and as the guard walked to the left side to open the door that led into the cell, he paused for the first time.
