

SPACEX FINISHED 5TH STARSHIP TEST FLIGHT

AN ADVANCEMENT ON SPACE EXLORATION

SpaceX, a space navigation and rocket design company run by the world's richest man, Elon Musk, has been working on their famous Starships in hope to bring humans back to the moon, and to one day, bring them to Mars.

Space exploration has been the final frontier of mankind since the Kennedy administration, and SpaceX

has been one of the most prominent leaders of this industry since 2002. The Starship program started with its first flight August 27, 2019, titled "Hoppy". In light of this

endeavor, Elon Musk has been trying to create rockets that would land back on the Earth after going into space. This would dramatically change the space industry, cutting the cost of space travel into fractions of what it is now.

On October 13, 2024, SpaceX sent up their fifth Starship test flight, and in light of their previous launches, all fingers were crossed. In complete shock, SpaceX staff watched as they narrowly and very finely landed their rocket by catching it in the arms of a tower with a height of around 480 feet, making their goal of having a fully reusable rocket possible and a reality. "What we just saw, that looked like magic," said Dan Huot, a SpaceX communications administrator.

SpaceX continues to this day to create more reusable rockets, until we

lous milestone, the possibility of the United States returning to the moon, or even stepping foot on Mars, Earth's neighboring planet, seems more possible than ever.



NASA WANTS TO GROW HOUSES MADE OUT OF MUSHROOMS ON THE MOON

Nasa is contemplating using Fungi to make habitable abodes on the moon for future colonization. Now, why mushrooms? The answer is simple really, it's cheaper than what we have right now.

Nasa has shown that Mushrooms can deflect radiation while also providing protection from the harsh temperatures from the lunar surface, they also can be grown extremely quickly at the rate of one to two months. Not only is it sustainable, but it's also a highly efficient alternative to conventional materials.



THE DEATH OF CELEBRITY LIAM PAYNE'S FORMER ONE DIRECTION STAR DEAD AT 31

Singer Liam Payne, who came to fame with the beloved band One Direction, died on Wednesday, October 16, at the age of 31. He was staying at a hotel in Palermo, Argentina, and fell from his balcony on the third floor.

The circumstances surrounding his death are still slightly mysterious, as we don't know whether his fall was accidental or not. It appears that he was under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol, and police had been called to the hotel minutes before the fall to address reports of an "aggressive man", per a statement given to NBC. The guest who made the call said that "when [Liam] is conscious he breaks the whole room" and "I don't know if he is at risk." Payne's autopsy report suggested that he "could have fallen in a state of semi or total unconsciousness."

Liam Payne auditioned for The X Factor at the age of 14, and while



he didn't make the cut the first time around, he was encouraged by Simon Cowell to try again when he was older. In 2010 he was put together with Niall Horan, Zayn Malik, Harry Styles, and Louis Tomlinson to compete on the show again as a group. They took on the name of One Direction and came in third place, signing to Cowell's label and becoming the band we know and love.

Liam was a frequent songwriter for the group, helping out on hits such as "Night Changes", "Steal My Girl", and "History", and after One Direction broke up he eased into working on solo albums, producing EDM music, and making collaborations with artists such as Rita Ora, Alesso, and Zedd. He also dated fellow singer Cheryl Cole from 2016-2018, and they have a seven-year-old son together named Bear.

Many fans around the world and all four of Payne's former bandmates have posted touching tributes on Instagram expressing their love for him and their shock and sadness at his passing. Niall Horan wrote that "The bond and friendship we had doesn't happen often in a lifetime", while Louis Tomlinson said that "Liam was in my opinion the most vital part of One Direction" and, speaking to Liam, "I want you to know that if Bear ever needs me I will be the Uncle he needs." Harry Styles described Payne as having "an energy for life that was infectious" and Zayn Malik wrote that "we could always rely on you to know which way to steer the ship next.... Love you bro."

Offering a vibrant campus life, diverse academic programs, and unparalleled opportunities for personal and professional growth, UAlbany is ready to welcome new transfer students from the HVCC, all you have to do is stop into the Office of Transfer Services and Dual Admissions! Staff have been given their own office on the HVCC campus to simplify and support the transfer process between the two institutions. This collaboration plays a crucial role in helping students achieve their educational goals as HVCC continues to

UAlbabe ny's largest source of transfer students, averaging about 200 students each year.

The HVCC-UA1bany transfer advisement program offers students detailed insights into transferring to the University at Albany. Students can schedule

appointments with transfer advisors to review their unofficial transcripts, estimate transferable credits, and discuss potential pathways that align with their goals. These services are designed to offer clarity on application requirements, transfer scholarships, campus life, and most notably, their dual admission program.

Dual admission students receive a University at Albany ID card, giving them access to the UAlbany library, athletic events, and student activities both on campus and at other locations. UAlbany's academic departments will

also reach out to students, offering opportunities to connect with faculty, participate in department activities, and get to know the university community. Additionally, during their second or third semester at HVCC, they will have the option to take a cross-registered course at UAlbany in their field of study, offering a head start in their UAlbany degree.

There is also a guaranteed UAlbany Transfer Merit Scholarship available for incoming dual admission students who achieve a GPA of 3.0 or higher during their time at HVCC.

Launched on HVCC's campus in 2019, the advisement program has evolved

transfer. "Come to campus, visit, and take advantage so that you can start to get a feel for UAlbany's campus life," she says. "Eat lunch on campus, visit the library, go to events, and take advantage of the lectures and guest speakers. Eyes on you (2:55): Immediately, this song gives such a happy mood to a rather gloomy industry, with an upbeat and bubbly feeling. It gives me 2016, on the beach, sunset type of vibes. For context, there are 13 members of SEVENTEEN, 3 subunits + 1 group + 13 members = 17. Each chorus has a couple lines with a promise to each other and to the fans. The second chorus says "I'll contact you before I go to sleep/When you're going through something tough. I'll lend you my

shoulder." The third chorus says "The thirteen promises I made/No matter what happens, I'll keep them for you." This song is so adorable, I love it! AARON RODGERS REUNITED WITH DAVANTE ADAMS

THE STRUGGLING JETS HOPE TO JUMPSTART THEIR OFFENSE BY ADDING A KEY PIECE

Earlier in the year I had written an opinion piece on how I thought the Jets offense would take a large step forward from last year with the return of Aaron Rodgers. But besides a few select flashes, I have been proven wrong. The Jets average just 18.8 points per game, and currently sit at 2-4. JUDGING CONTROVERSIES IN THE UFC: A CASE STUDY OF ALDO VS. BAUTISTA

Recent events in the UFC have highlighted an issue concerning the judging criteria

used in professional mixed martial arts. A notable example was the recent fight between José

Aldo and Mario Bautista, which took place at UFC 307.

In the first round, Bautista demonstrated control over the fight, there was little significant activity from either fighter. The second round saw Aldo regain momentum, even managing to open a cut near Bautista's eye, effectively evening the score at one round 19-19.

As the third round began, Aldo landed some impactful strikes, while Bautista resorted to

desperation takedown attempts and maintained clinch control of Aldo against the cage. The referee intervened multiple times to separate the fighters. In the final moments, Aldo appeared

to secure the round with a series of solid strikes, while Bautista's offense consisted primarily of minimal knees

Despite Aldo's performance, the judges awarded the fight to Bautista by split decision, with

scores of 29-28 from two judges and one score of 29-28 for Aldo. The announcement of the

decision prompted the Salt Lake City crowd to boo, reflecting widespread dissatisfaction with

the outcome.

This fight exemplifies a broader issue within the UFC: judges often overlook the critical aspect of damage when scoring fights. A fundamental principle of mixed martial arts judging seems to have been forgotten, undermining the integrity of the sport. If this continues, it risks alienating fans and driving them to explore other pro-

motions such as PFL, ONE or Karate Combat.

To address this problem, one potential solution is to provide additional training for judges,

emphasizing the importance of damage in scoring. Another option could be to revise the current

10-point must system to incorporate a hybrid model that better reflects fight-finishing

sequences. While implementing such changes may be challenging, the alternative—a

diminished sport-poses a far greater risk to the future of MMA.

YANKEES BACK IN THE WORLD SERIES

THE NEW YORK YANKEES FIRST TIME IN THE WORLD SERIES SINCE 2009

The team with the most World Series titles finds themselves with a chance to add another one. Since their inception in 1903, the New York Yankees have accumulated 27 MLB championships. This is nearly 2.5 times more than the second most successful team, the St.Louis Cardinals who only have 11. But despite this, recent postseason history has not included the Yankees, as they have not participated in a World Series since the

2009 season. What did they change from their disappointing 15 year stretch of not obtaining the American League Pennant in order to do so with little resistance in 2024?

Despite making the playoffs in all but four seasons since 09', the Yankees have lacked recent postseason success. They made the AL Championship Se-



ries in five of those years, but lost every appearance, including two sweeps. They lost in the Divisional three times, and the Wildcard twice. But this season they barely struggled, winning the Divisional against the Royals 3-1 and were one out away from sweeping the Guardians in the championship series. The team the Yankees fielded this year was more similar than the one they did in 2023 than many would have thought. After missing the postseason for the first time since 2016 last year, many thought that the team would get blown up by the owners and start anew. There were calls to fire manager Aaron Boone, as well as trade superstar Aaron Judge. But ownership held out and instead made moves to add to the team. This included bringing in a new pitching and hitting coach in Carlos Mendoza and Casey Dykes. Then signing pitcher Carlos Rodón, who has been excellent for them this season. And to top it off they acquired Juan Soto in a blockbuster trade with the Padres.

All of these trades and a trust in the 2023 team and management have obviously proven to be successful as the Yankees are set to face off against either the Mets or Dodg-

ers for a chance to add a record 28th Championship trophy to the franchises historic history.
