

P. DIDDY ARRESTED AMID ALLEGATIONS OF "FREAK-OFF" PARTIES

ONE OF HOLLYWOOD'S BIGGEST SECRETS, CURRENTLY BEING EXPOSED

Hip-hop icon Sean "Diddy" Combs" known for his empire in music, fashion, and entertainment was arrested on September 17 following an ongoing investigation for allegations of wild, illicit parties commonly referred to as "freak-offs". The arrest has sent shockwaves throughout the entertainment industry, as the rumors surrounding these exclusive gatherings have long been considered celebrity gossip. Authorities reported that up to a thousand bottles of baby oil, a recurring detail in the rumors, were found at the scene, reigniting questions about these events.

One of the more bizarre details of Diddy's alleged "freak-off" parties has been the persistent mention of baby oil, supposedly a key element of the wild and uninhibited atmosphere. These events were rumored to involve wild behavior, with a guest list limited to top models, musicians, and other elite figures.

SPACE X TO SEND UNCREWED SHIPS TO MARS IN 2026

MUSK EXPANDS SPACE X TO UNCHARTED TERRITORY!

SpaceX CEO Elon Musk announced on his social-media site X on Sunday, September 7 that the company in a bold move towards interplanetary exploration, plans to send 5 uncrewed Starships to mars within the next couple of years. The first is set to launch

This mission represents a significant step in the company's vision of establishing a human presence on the Red Planet and increasing our understanding of its environment. The mission will utilize SpaceX's Starship spacecraft, which is designed for deepspace travel and equipped to endure the harsh Martian environment. The objective of this mission is to try and deliver essential equipment, scientific instruments, and supplies to Mars, all of which would be crucial for future human missions. Musk emphasized the importance of this mission during his announcement.

LOCAL MATERNITY HOMES: GET THE RESOURCES YOU NEED ENSURE A BETTER LIFE FOR YOUR CHILD

Young women who find themselves pregnant and desire to raise their babies but are in need of material support. You can find help through at least two programs in New York State.

Glory House and New Life Maternityoffer a safe home for disadvantaged expectant mothers to begin getting back on their feet and building a future to provide for themselves and their children.

Both programs house up to three women at a time. The first thing a woman does at these homes is discuss her goals and create a plan on how to achieve them, whether it is obtaining a driver's license, saving or completing their education.

For the duration of their stay, mothers work towards those goals with the support of staff. Daily life in a home like New Life Maternity typically involves taking turns helping out with cleaning, laundry, planning and cooking meals, and finances.

New Life Maternity also provides online classes through BrightCourse, a video streaming service that helps teach life skills, prenatal care, and more. In Glory House, mothers can stay for all nine months of their pregnancy plus the first three months following the birth of their child.

If they show proof of working on their education, they can stay for an additional year as needed. Similarly, New Life Maternity encourages women to stay after they give birth until they have completed their goals or otherwise feel ready to leave.

CHASE BANK "GLITCH"...AND THE AFTERMATH

A STORY ON WHY IN LIFE, NOTHING IN THIS WORLD IS FREE

In early September, people across the country found a glitch in Chase Bank's system that led them to believe they could instantly receive "infinite money." What's in store for those who tried to cheat the system? How did this happen in the first place? Let's make "cents" of it all.

When somebody goes to deposit a check, most banks put a hold on the deposit so that the check's authenticity can be verified. This also allows the bank to deny the deposit if the check "bounces" or can't be cleared due to insufficient funds.

Chase Bank account holders discovered a glitch in the system where this holding period was skipped for one reason or another. The funds that they deposited into their account were instantly available, even if the check itself wasn't valid. If the funds were withdrawn, people could walk out with virtually any amount of cash.

So people did just that, they began writing checks for large amounts of money that they did not have, some checks being worth tens, if not hundreds of thousands of dollars. These checks would be instantly deposited and the funds would be withdrawn, allowing people to walk away from an ATM with these massive amounts of cash.

People took to social media to en-

courage others to participate in this "infinite money glitch," and it began trending in no time. Posts were made to all platforms with people flaunting the money in their bank accounts or the cash that they had just taken out from the ATM.

This joyous celebration of people winning big and cashing out was relatively short-lived as posts quickly shifted into panic and a looming feeling of regret. The reality of what people had just done, and what was in store for them began to hit hard. These individuals were no longer just everyday people who had found a loophole in the system, they were criminals, and they had just openly committed check fraud.

When Chase Bank's staff and systems began to catch up to what had just happened, people's accounts began reflecting their actions. If somebody had \$200 in their account and withdrew \$40,000 using a fraudulent check, their account balance was now showing a heartstopping \$-39,800. All of that "infinite money" had to come from somewhere, and now, all of it has to be paid back.

The best case scenario for individuals who participated in this trend is that they did not spend the cash and can return it to the bank. This will most likely result in a closed account and them being reported to Chexsystems, which is like a credit report for bank accounts specifically.

If somebody doesn't have the money anymore, this is where things start to take a turn. The bank is going to collect their money one way or another, the mechanisms to collect vary by state, but wage garnishment and property liens would be the most likely options.

Regardless of whether or not the money was paid back, these individuals all face the risk of being criminally charged with check fraud. While the exact mechanism was new, this was just a different version of a crime that's been around for years.

Realistically, the majority of these people aren't going to be able to have a bank account in the US for a while. There will probably be no chances of having credit cards, taking out loans, or buying cars or homes.

"Chase Bank glitch? No, that's called fraud," a TikTok user said in a viral video. "You went to the bank and took \$50,000 that didn't belong to you. That's not a life hack, that's called robbery. You're going to jail. Prison actually"

So when it comes to banking and money, if it seems way too good to be true, it probably is. Never try to outsmart the bank, they will always win in the end and that money will always have to be paid back, even if you don't have it anymore.

RYAN ROUTH OFFERS \$150K TO "FINISH THE JOB"

MAN SUSPECTED OF TRYING TO KILL FORMER PRESIDENT TRUMP TRIES TO FURTHER HIS PLANS

Ryan Routh, the suspect in the secnond assassination attempt carried out on Donald Trump left a note behind offering \$150,000 to any person who can "finish the job."

Portions of the note entitled "Dear World," read, "This was an assassination attempt on Donald Trump but I failed you," and "I tried my best and gave it all the gumption I could muster. It is up to you now to finish the job; and I will offer \$150,000 to whomever can complete the job."

An unnamed individual claims to have received the note in a box a few months before the attempted assassination. This individual says that they did not open the box until after they had heard news reports of what had occurred at Trump's Florida golf club.

Investigators also retrieved a notebook from Routh's residence that contained a list of dates and locations of Donald Trump's campaign appearances. It is believed that Routh had been


planning his crimes for at least one month before he carried it out.

Lawyer Kristine Millitello says that a substantial amount of Routh's writings from before he committed his crimes included mentions of a failed assassination attempt, leading her to believe that Routh could have had the intent to fail and that this could have been a possible publicity stunt on Routh's end.

The gathering of these pieces of writing are important pieces of evidence for the trial that will take place, and prosecutors say that they will be showing the evidence to the jury and attempting to indict Routh on multiple charges. These include firearms charges, assaulting a federal officer, and attempted assassination, a charge that could potentially land Routh with a life sentence.

PENN STATE ADMINS REMOVE STUDENT NEWSRACKS WITHOUT WARNING

WHY THE UNIVERSITY HAS CHOSEN TO GO THROUGH WITH THIS DRASTIC CHANGE

The state of Pennsylvania is the home to a wonderful landmark, called the Liberty Bell. Also within Pennsylvania, is the college powerhouse Penn State University. 
Now while I am personally not a fan of either of the two candidates running this year, I will not stand for unfairly blocking people from express-



When asked to describe the word "snowmobile", most would find the task rather easy. Rightfully so, the definition is quite literally in the word. But what if I told you that snowmobiles are not just limited to snow or even land for that matter, but can and are used on water. An uncommonly explored option, but one that once seen is truly mesmerizing.

The art of snowmobile "skipping", most commonly referred to as watercross, is a concept that is not new, but one that is constantly evolving. It is made possible by the inherent design of a snowmobile, which has a wide track for traction and surface area contact to stay above the snow, a CVT drive

system that eliminates the need for shifting gears, and a two-stroke engine that has a great power to weight ratio. Because of these factors, as long as a snowmobile makes contact with the water carrying enough speed relative to its weight, it will keep itself afloat.

Watercrossing can be done with most stock snowmobiles with the right conditions and rider, but anyone looking to utilize a snowmobile primarily for watercross has plenty of modifications that they can make. One of the most important changes is tailoring the sled so that the rider can stand while controlling it, crucial in the handling and turning aspects. This can be accomplished by adding handlebar risers to an appropriate height relative to the rider, eliminating the need for the seat. Removing the seat is also

beneficial to weight savings, another key aspect of modifications. Any non essential part of the sled that can be removed, is, and any swappable heavier parts are switched. The skis are a big part of this, as watercross skis are very small compared to their normal counterparts, they are also usually brought closer into the body of the sled to help with handling. The powertrain of the sled is usually also modified, to push out as much power as possible. The easiest way to accomplish this is by removing the stock exhaust and putting in a "can", a significantly lighter and less baffled version of a stock exhaust. Running race fuel is another way to get more out of your engine. But with most modifications made to improve the performance of a stock sled, tuning needs to be done to ensure all aspects are compensated for the changes.

After these modified sleds are engineered and mechanically construct-

ed, where does one go to utilize them? The Northeastern US and Canada are a hotbed for watercross racing, with many of the sports largest races being held here. One of them being the Fall Classic hosted by the Flat Rock Inn in Lowville, NY. Bringing in racers from all around, the Fall Classic is a New York State Watercross Association (NYSWA) sanctioned event that hosts a multitude of The most classes. anticipated races are

the oval races though, where riders go head to head in a race around the pond hoping to complete the laps faster than their competitors. There are three engine classes (600cc, 700cc, and 800cc) and three different skill levels, Amutur, Semi-Pro, and Pro.

Despite the many different classes, all of them are competitive from the drop of the green flag in the first heat.

It is truly quite the sight to see and hear in person, and is unlike any competition I have ever attended. This article just scratches the surface of the sport itself and my experience, but if it interests you I recommend watching a couple videos on it, it truly is one of the most interesting forms of racing out there and the viewing experience is second to none.
